- Read all information sent home as this gives me important details of relevant policies, meetings, workshops, activities, newsletters and open days.
- Ensure that photos I take of my child at school events are for personal use and not shared on social media.

- Use your talents and experiences to enhance your child's learning at home. Your child will benefit greatly from what you can show them, discuss with them and teach them.
