The monitoring visit we had in February was additional to the usual monitoring process for schools that are judged to require improvement. The purpose was to ensure that school was providing all pupils, including those learning at home and in school, with education. The more recent visit was part of the normal schedule of monitoring for a school with a RI grading to judge whether we are taking effective steps to move towards being graded a good school. Neither of these visits will change our current grading, this will be done when we receive a full inspection from Ofsted. These are due to resume from September 2021. We will let you all know when we receive the report from this most recent visit.
